

## Yankees place A-Rod on 15-day DL

The New York Yankees placed designated hitter Alex Rodriguez on the 15-day disabled list Wednesday with a strained right hamstring.

## MLB NOTEBOOK

A-Rod had an MRI on Wednesday morning after injuring his hamstring in Tuesday night's 4-1 loss to the Baltimore Orioles.

The 40-year-old Rodriguez left the game after he grabbed at his right hamstring while running out a grounder in the fifth.

Rodriguez is struggling this season, hitting .194 with five home runs and 12 RBIs. He is in the next-to-last season of his 10-year, \$275 million contract, and is being paid \$21 million this year and next.

In March, Rodriguez an-

nounced he is planning to retire at the end of the 2017 season after playing out his contract.

The Yankees also recalled left-handed reliever James Pazos from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He has a 3.00 ERA with 12 strikeouts in 12 innings at Triple-A.

### MLB mulls Puerto Rico Zika risk

Major League Baseball has yet to make a decision on the fate of two games between the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Miami Marlins on May 30-31 in San Juan because of health concerns associated with the Zika virus outbreak.

El Nuevo Dia, a Spanish-language newspaper, reported that the games would be canceled.

Both teams recently voted on whether or not they wanted to travel in Puerto

Rico later this month. The results were sent to MLB.

The players' union met with MLB officials on Monday to discuss the situation. Yahoo Sports reported Tuesday that the games could be moved to Miami, but under terms of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, the union and MLB would have to agree on the location change.

The final two games of the four-game series between the teams were already scheduled for Miami on June 1-2.

### Indians acquire Gimenez

The Cleveland Indians added backup catcher Chris Gimenez in a deal with the Texas Rangers for cash considerations.

The move was made after Cleveland backup catcher Roberto Perez suf-

fered an injured right thumb last weekend and was placed on the 15-day disabled list.

To clear space on the 40-man roster, the Indians designated catcher Adam Moore for assignment.

The 33-year-old Gimenez is joining the Indians for the third time in his career. The team drafted him in 2004 and he made his major league debut with the Indians in 2009. He left after the 2010 season and spent time with the Tampa Bay Rays and the Texas Rangers before returning to Cleveland in 2014 for eight games.

Gimenez began the 2016 season on the disabled list with an infection in his right ankle. He started a rehab assignment with Double-A Frisco on April 25 before the Rangers designated him for assignment on Tuesday.

## Schwanz, Johnson propel UM by Colby

WATERVILLE — Tyler Schwanz stroked a two-run home run and two doubles on Wednesday afternoon, sparking the University of Maine to a 9-3 baseball victory over Colby College at Coombs Field.

Schwanz hit a two-run homer during a four-run second inning that gave the Black Bears (11-22) the lead for good. Danny Casals collected a triple and two singles and Jeremy Pena doubled and singled (two RBIs) for UMaine.

Kevin Stypulkowski belted a two-run homer and a single and Colin Ridley drove in two runs with a double and a single for the Bears, who collected 13 hits.

Sophomore left-hander Connor Johnson (3-4) picked up the pitching win with five innings of two-hit, shutout relief. He struck out nine and did not walk a batter after Jonah Normandeau of Cumberland gave up four hits and two runs (one earned) in the first inning.

Zach Ellenthal paced Division III Colby (16-27) with a double and two singles, while Tyler Mulberry and Matt Garcia delivered run-scoring singles, both in the first inning.

Starter Will Cohen (2-3) suffered the loss for the Mules after allowing four hits and four runs (three earned) over the first four innings. He fanned three and walked one.

Colby jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first. Ellenthal doubled and Tommy Forese reached on an error by Casals. Mulberry and Garcia followed with consecutive RBI singles.

Normandeau gave up another single before inducing an inning-ending double play.

UMaine responded with four runs in the second in-

## Falcons sign first-round pick Keanu Neal

The Atlanta Falcons and first-round safety Keanu Neal agreed to terms on a contract Wednesday.

## NFL NOTEBOOK

Neal, the 17th overall selection out of Florida, is the only first-round pick of the 2016 NFL Draft class so far to agree to terms on his contract.

Neal, who turns 21 in July, will sign the slotted four-year deal, with a fifth-year option to be exercised by May 3, 2019.

The 6-foot-1, 216-pound Neal started 19 of the 34 games he played in during his three years at Florida. During his first year as a

starter in 2014, he racked up 45 total tackles and three interceptions, which was the second-highest total on the team. During his junior year, Neal finished third on the team with 96 total tackles.

### Tuck to retire with Giants

Defensive end Justin Tuck plans to sign a one-day contract with the New York Giants and officially retire as a member of the team.

According to ESPN, Tuck will sign the one-day contract with the Giants on Friday.

The 33-year-old Tuck announced in February that he was retiring after 11 NFL seasons. Tuck spent the last two years with the Oakland

Raiders after playing for the Giants from 2005 to 2013. He won two Super Bowl rings with the Giants.

Tuck, who played just five games for the Raiders in 2015 due to a torn pectoral muscle, recorded 66.5 career sacks and had 10 or more in a season on four occasions. Tuck added 5.5 postseason sacks.

### Alexander, Vikings strike deal

Cornerback Mackensie Alexander, the Minnesota Vikings' second-round draft pick, left Clemson after his redshirt sophomore season for financial reasons, and he took the first step toward reaping that reward when he struck a deal with the team.

Alexander, who was the

54th overall draft pick, will sign his contract on Thursday, multiple media outlets reported. He reportedly agreed to sign a four-year, \$4.3 million contract with a \$1.34 million signing bonus.

Alexander grew up in the small agricultural town of Immokalee, Florida. Most of the town's residents are immigrants from Mexico or Haiti, and Alexander's parents were from Haiti. Almost half the people in Immokalee live below the poverty line.

The Vikings were the first team to sign a draft pick — sixth-round German wide receiver Moritz Boehringer. He needed to get deal done to begin his application for a work visa.
