

Bonny Eagle Scots (0-2) at Bangor Rams (0-2), 7 p.m. Friday: This may be a crossroads game of sorts between two perennial Class A contenders. Bonny Eagle of Standish is coming off two narrow defeats, 18-14 to South Portland and 27-26 to Scarborough,

while Bangor is looking for its first win under new coach Al Mosca after last week's 42-0 loss at defending regional champion Windham. The availability of standout Bangor half-back-linebacker Dane Johnson (39 carries, 201 yards, 2 TDs), who sat out much of the Windham game because of injury, will be a key factor.

Gardiner Tigers (0-2) at Brewer Witches (2-0), 7 p.m. Friday: After last weekend's rugged 20-13 victory at Mt. Blue of Farmington, Brewer must be careful not to look past Gardiner with unbeaten Skowhegan, 1-1 Cony of Augusta and defending Class B North champion Brunswick looming over the next three weekends. Gardiner has struggled as it approaches its first road game of the season, falling to Messalonskee of Oakland and Skowhegan by a combined 86-20.

Messalonskee Eagles (1-1) at Hampden Academy Broncos (1-1), 7 p.m. Friday: Both teams are coming off relatively high-scoring performances, Messalonskee in a 33-26 loss to Cony of Augusta and Hampden in its 40-8 win at Nokomis of Newport — Scott Flagg's first victory as the Broncos' head coach. Each team has its share of play-makers, among them Messalonskee running back Jack Bernatchez and Hampden wideout Jake Black, who caught a touchdown pass and returned an interception for another score last week.
