

# UMPI baseball sweeps doubleheader

CONCORD, New Hampshire — Matt Curry’s sacrifice fly in the top of the eighth gave the University of Maine-Presque Isle Owls a 6-5 baseball victory over the NHTI Lynx and a doubleheader sweep Saturday.

UMPI won the first game 5-1.

### COLLEGE ROUNDUP

Jesus Garcia earned the win for UMPI in the first game as he turned in a 114-pitch effort in eight innings, allowing eight hits and five runs. He didn’t walk a batter and struck out seven.

Ryan Sanderson hit a solo homer and singled to spark UMPI (8-16) while Adam Begos notched three hits and an RBI and Saul Nunez had an RBI double.

Michael Kernan led NHTI (1-6) with two hits and two RBIs.

Andrew Bartlett earned the win for UMPI in the first game after allowing 10 hits but just one run in 6 2/3 innings. He walked four and struck out four.

Sanderson tripled, singled and drove in two runs for the Owls while Curry chipped in with a double and two singles. Tommy Collins also had two hits.

Cody Bassett recorded three hits for NHTI.

### Castleton sweeps UMF

At Castleton, Vermont, the Spartans limited the Beavers to a single run while sweeping a North Atlantic Conference doubleheader by scores of 5-1 and 8-0 on Saturday.

Castleton also swept UMF on Sunday 6-2 and 6-2.

In Saturday’s second game, Charles Stapleford pitched a four-

hitter with seven strikeouts and four walks to complete the sweep. Mitchell Caron singled twice with three RBIs to lead Castleton. Taylor Vile belted a solo home run and a double and Nick Swim doubled and singled.

Tyler Flayhan singled twice for the University of Maine-Farmington behind losing pitcher Riley Chickering.

In the first game, Devin Hayes and Michael LaBeau combined on a four-hitter for the Spartans. Nick Swim collected three singles and two RBIs and Zach Bahan had a single and two RBIs.

Jimmy Parks doubled with an RBI and Sean Cabaniss tripled for UMF. Nate Pushard took the loss.

In Sunday’s first game, Steven Jurkiewicz scattered four hits and two runs to lead Castleton by UMF.

to settle for a share of second place after carding an adventurous one-over 73 that included a quadruple bogey and seven birdies.

The American world No. 2 had stormed five strokes in front with nine holes to play and victory seemingly assured when he bogeyed the 10th and 11th before running up a nightmare seven at the par-three 12th.

“It’s tough, it’s really tough,” Spieth told CBS Sports about his stunning three-hole collapse, his voice cracking with emotion. “Pretty sure I’ll be disappointed with that one.”

“Just put a bad swing on it right at the wrong time. Just compounded mistakes. Just lack of discipline. A very tough 30 minutes for me that hopefully I will never experience again.”

Finishing level with Spieth at two under was England’s former world No. 1 Lee Westwood who, still seeking a first major title after recording 17 top-10 finishes during a stellar career, returned a 69.

England’s Paul Casey (67) and Americans J.B. Holmes (68) and Dustin Johnson (71) tied for fourth at one under while world No. 3 Rory McIlroy, seeking to complete a career grand slam of the majors, returned a 71 to share 10th place.

After three rounds of gusting winds, players were greeted by the coldest temperatures of the week but the calmest conditions as Sunday’s final round began with an abundance of compelling possible storylines in the melting pot.

For the first nine holes, Spieth was his usual unflappable self as he mixed five birdies with a lone bogey and several clutch putts to reach the turn five strokes clear at seven under, seemingly in total command.

However, the 22-year-old

Texan bogeyed the 10th, after bunkering his approach, and also the 11th, after his tee shot sailed right into the trees, before the tricky 12th took an even more severe toll.

After hitting successive shots into the waters of Rae’s

Creek in front of the 12th green, Spieth found a back bunker with his fifth en route to a mind-boggling seven, tumbling back into a tie for fourth at one under.

Though he did well to rebound with birdies on both

par-fives, the 13th and 15th, he also bogeyed 17 after bunkering his approach and was never able to catch Willett, who picked up shots at the 13th, 14th and 16th to give himself a cushion.

“I had my ‘B minus’ game tee to green, and I made up for it around the greens with my putter,” said Spieth. “Ultimately you just have to have your ‘A’ game every single part, and I just didn’t have those iron swings, as it showed on the back nine.”

Bryson DeChambeau, who will turn pro Thursday at the RBC Heritage and was in the hunt for two rounds, shot a third 72 and tied for 21st to finish as low amateur.

Two-time Masters champion Bernhard Langer of Germany, 58, who amazed the field by finishing round three only two shots behind Spieth, struggled to a 79 and tied for 24th.

Davis Love III, Shane Lowry of Ireland and Louis Oosthuizen all made holes in one on the 16th hole.

## Husson baseball team sweeps, softball splits

BANGOR — The Husson University baseball team swept Lyndon State while the softball team split with Castleton University in North Atlantic Conference doubleheaders played on campus Saturday.

Junior righthander Ben Walls scattered six hits and two runs over seven innings to give the Husson baseball team a 6-2 win over Lyndon in the first game of a doubleheader at the Winkin Complex.

The Eagles of Bangor (11-9, 6-2 NAC) beat Lyndon (Vt.) in the second game 16-1.

In the first game, Walls walked only one and struck out three. He was backed up by Julien Boone, who tripled, singled and drove in three runs.

Sam Huston added two hits and an RBI for the Eagles while Zach Sugar and J.T. Whitten also each drove in a run and singled.

Michael Pena and Jake Jourdain each had an RBI for Lyndon (3-13, 0-4 NAC).

In the second game, the Eagles banged out 15 hits to support winning pitcher Ryan Allender, who gave up four hits and a run in four innings. He walked one and struck out three.

Sugar had a single, sacrifice fly and three RBIs to lead the Eagles. Huston chipped in with two hits and two RBIs and Christian Corneil smacked a two-run triple.

Whitten chipped in with two hits for the Eagles while Dylan Graffam had a two-run triple and Darik Messier had a two-run double.

In softball action at O’Keefe Field, Kayla Wood tossed a three-hitter, striking out 13 and walking three, and Jessica Babcock had

three singles and scored twice as Castleton University salvaged a split of the doubleheader with a 5-2 triumph.

Husson won the opener 3-2 in eight innings.

Both runs off Wood were unearned.

In the nightcap, the Spartans (6-6, 1-1 North Atlantic Conference) parlayed three Husson errors and a Babcock single into two unearned first-inning runs to take the lead for good.

Chelsea Grady and Timi Carone hit RBI singles for Castleton

Elizabeth Richard had an RBI double and Katie Gagne hit two singles for Husson (3-15, 1-1 NAC).

In the opener, Lyndsay Merrill singled home Kristen Chipman in the bottom of the eighth as Husson prevailed.

In accordance with the extra-inning rules, Chipman was placed on second with nobody out and Merrill singled her home.

Castleton hadn’t scored in the top of the eighth.

The Spartans had tied the game in the seventh on Britnyan Brayman’s RBI single.

Merrill had four singles for the Eagles, Sami Cyr had an RBI single and Alannah Healy went the distance, allowing 11 hits and one earned run with seven strikeouts and no walks.

Babcock had two singles to go with her double for the Spartans. Carone had two doubles while Brayman and Grady had two singles each.

“I had two strikes so I was looking to put the ball in play and hit it up the middle. I wanted to keep my hands inside the ball. It was an inside pitch and I kind of turned on it,” said Lennon.

Maddie Moore singled her in.

Leonard’s single, two walks and an infield throwing error produced a second-inning run but Sydney Walsh, who had replaced

Talcik with one out in the inning, went on to pitch 4 2/3 innings of excellent two-hit, shutout relief.
