Husson football routs Alfred State

Offense propels Eagles to 44-2 win

ALFRED, New York — Husson rushed for 356 yards and five touchdowns Saturday, rolling to a 44-2 win over Alfred State at Pioneer Stadium.

John Smith had over 100 rushing yards in the first quarter and finished with 184 yards on 29 carries and three touchdowns, while Logan Steward added 128 yards on 18 rushes, including a 49-yard touchdown scamper early in the fourth quarter.

The Eagles defense smothered Alfred State (0-2) to the tune of a 41 yards of total offense, the fewest allowed in a single game, including minus-9 net yards rushing.

Husson's Kenny Sweet totaled three interceptions, tying the school's single-game record held by Adam Scott and Chad Bennett (twice). He also had four pass breakups.

Husson forced four turnovers Saturday and has seven in the first two contests this year.

The Eagles racked up 411 yards of total offense.

After giving up a safety on a bad snap on a punt, Husson rattled off 44 unanswered points, starting with Smith's one-yard plunge in the first quarter to cap a 55-yard drive.

Deon Wiggins returned a punt 55 yards for a score nearly two minutes later to make it 14-3.

Smith posted a 6-yard TD run 29 seconds into the second quarter to finish off an 11-play, 92-yard drive. His third score came from three yards out to cap a 14-play, 75-yard march.

Alfred fell on its own fumble in the end zone five minutes before halftime, giving the Eagles a 30-2 edge.

After a scoreless third quarter, Steward's touchdown burst came on the second play of the fourth, as he accounted for all 58 yards on two-play series.

Joe Farrell's blocked punt set up a Stephen Day 3-yard TD run with 5:17 remaining.

Kenneth Nelson had 13 tackles to lead Alfred State.

his record to 3-2 as he connected with a right hand that stopped veteran Tollison Lewis in their 150-pound professional bout.

In the main event of the 20-fight show, Bellator and World Series of Fighting veteran Sidney Outlaw defeated New Yorker Darius Heyliger by rear-naked choke in the first round. Heyliger, a frequent competitor on NEF cards in 2012 and 2013, was attempting a comeback after two years away from the cage, but Outlaw (5-1) scored an early takedown and controlled the match until he

could force the stoppage. Heyliger fell to 5-3.

The card also featured two women's amateur bouts, with Hannah Sparrell of Newcastle and Boston-based Rachel Reinheimer scoring unanimous-decision victories.

Reinheimer (2-0) opened the show by outlasting the debuting Angela Young — wife of Young's MMA founder Chris Young — in a battle of strikers. The combatants split the first two rounds before Reinheimer won a tightly contested final round to earn the victory.

Sparrell, competing for First Class MMA of Brunswick, used effective knee strikes to help build an early lead en route to her victory over Kira Innocenti of

Young's MMA in a battle of first-time competitors.

NEF officials also announced that its next promotion — NEF XX — will be a combination MMA-boxing show scheduled for Nov. 21 at the Colisee highlighted by NEF professional lightweight champion Bruce Boyington in the MMA main event and popular light welterweight Brandon Berry of West Forks in the featured boxing match.

Boyington (10-8) will defend his belt against Jimmy "Jimbo Slice" Davidson (7-1) of Sandwich, Massachusetts, while an opponent has not yet been named for Berry, 9-1 with six knockouts as a professional. Other announced fights

on the November card will include Billy Leahy (3-1) defending his NEF MMA amateur heavyweight championship against Dave Smith (2-0), and Randi Beth Boyington (1-1) facing undefeated Erin Lamonte (3-0) in a women's MMA contest.

Among other notable pro results from NEF XIX, light heavyweight Michael Hansen scored a first-round stoppage of Crowsneck Boutin while Jesse Erickson of Auburn earned his third straight victory with a first-round armbar against Ricky Sylvester.

Other amateur results included C.J. Ewer earning a unanimous decision over Ricky Dexter in a battle of Bangor-area welterweights.

yards and two touchdowns on six carries despite nursing a sore Achilles' tendon. His two scores, on runs of 32 and 14 yards, marked the only TDs of the second quarter as Mount View stretched its lead to 27-0 at the break.

Jack Axsom added 82 yards and a third-quarter touchdown on eight tries while Darrin Cook contributed 49 yards — including a first-quarter TD run spanning 7 yards — on nine attempts.

That ground game, which averaged 7 yards per carry, was ignited by the blocking of

linemen Ethan Sewell-Berry, Colton Medina, Owen Cunningham, Alex Sobey and Casey Spaulding.

"Give Dexter credit," said Pratt, whose club hosts MCI next Saturday afternoon. "We ran option anytime we wanted to last week (a 49-12 win over Camden Hills of Rockport); today they took it away from us. But we have quite a few weapons."

Mount View limited 0-2 Dexter to 185 total yards, including an 8-for-16, 82-yard passing performance by junior quarterback Brayden Miller.

"We definitely improved our defense today," said Ripley. "We didn't have to change a whole lot, but we made better tackles ... gang tackles."

Miller did set up Dexter's lone touchdown through the air late in the third quarter with completions of 35 yards to Zach White and 21 yards to Bryce Salisbury before Salisbury ran the ball in from the 1 to complete a five-play, 60-yard march and cut the deficit to 34-8.

But Davis got that score back for Mount View, capping off a 71-yard march with a 20-yard scoring run with 3:06 left in the game.

"We haven't put together back-to-back games like this in a long time so I'm proud of the overall play, especially on defense," said Pratt. "I thought we swarmed to the ball well, tackled a whole lot better than we had been. We

did have some breakdowns that we need to clean up a little bit, but all in all we played pretty well today."

as a genuine icon and pillar of the most storied era in the history of Philadelphia 76ers basketball," the team said in a statement posted on its website.

The 12-time All-Star averaged 20.6 points per game and 12.2 rebounds over his career. His 16,212 rebounds rank fifth on the NBA's all-time list and his 27,409 career points rank eighth, finishing his career with the San Antonio Spurs during the 1994-95 season.

He signed with the Utah Stars of the American

Basketball Association in 1974. He played the following season for the Spirits of St. Louis before moving to the Buffalo Braves after the ABA-NBA merger in 1976.

Allen Iverson reacted on Twitter about Malone's passing: "My condolences to the family and friends of Moses Malone. You will truly be missed. Rest in peace Big Mo!!!"

John Lucas tweeted: "Moses Malone, I will miss you no we all will miss you. Just left practice on your court. Well Done as always MVP."
