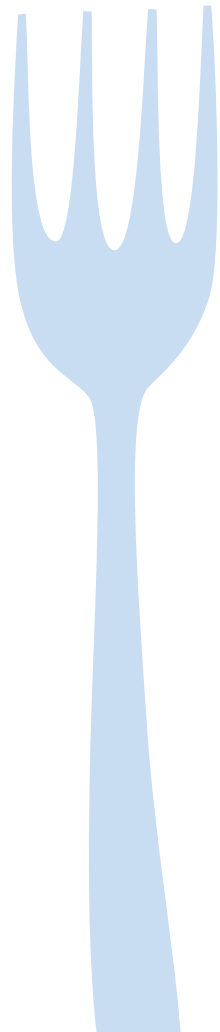


Meet the JUDGES
