who are concerned about the restrictions the rules will place on owning and selling certain exotic snakes, lizards and turtles, Snyder said.

According to the proposal, the rules will provide categories for different wildlife species based on levels of risk and describes the conditions

that must be met in order to acquire a permit for each category of species. This rule proposes very limited species to be placed in each category.

DIF&W will take public comments into consideration while making a formal decision about the rules in August.

In addition, a technical committee will be reconvened and will focus on making recommendations for additional species to be placed in each category.

Species and category recommendations will be provided to the DIF&W Commissioner to consider during a separate rulemaking process anticipated during fall of 2016.
