Is calling a movie 'faith-based' too limiting?

LOS ANGELES — A recent stream of movies with religious elements "Risen," "The Young Messi-"Miracles From Heaven" and the upcoming "God Is Not Dead 2" — have been hitting theaters. There was a time when any movie that touched on religion would be lumped under the "faithbased" category.

Those working on such projects now see the tag as limiting.

Although "Risen" deals with the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ, the main thrust is a crime story procedural. Those behind the movie see that as a way of bringing in believers and nonbelievers.

reasons to be entertained by 'Risen,'" Mickey Liddell, executive producer of "Risen," said in a news release about the movie.

Despite its deeply religious roots, Joseph Fiennes, who plays the Roman Tribune who investigates the disappearance of Christ's body from the tomb in "Risen," doesn't see his film as being primarily faithbased. He sees it as having a broader message.

"Redemption is a big theme, whether you are religious or not," Fiennes said. "The big takeaway is how

'The conservatists will say, 'Don't see it because it flies in the face of Scripture.' Then you get the other side who say it's preachy. "One type is a faith-based movie done by faith-based people for faith-based people, and one that's done for the general market," Jakes said. "If you define faithbased films as being this Pollyanna, Sunday school-type story, then 'Miracles' is not that. It is a gritty, real look at a human being struggling to get their child well against all odds.

'My only concern is that when we categorize this film as faith-based, it will limit the audience this film deserves," he said.

He puts "Miracles from Heaven" in the latter category because while the movie touches on religious elements, it is aimed at a broader audience because it deals hopefully, it comes across

Use of the phrase faith- with a lot of other elements, based for Jakes depends on especially family. Most of the movie focuses on the fight by a Texas family to deal with their daughter's incurable disease and her miraculous recovery.

Jennifer Garner, who plays the mother in "Miracles from Heaven," had numerous conversations with the producers, writers and director about the religious elements in the movie.

"It's one thing to play a family for whom religion is their backbone. That is something I can definitely relate to," Garner said. "It's another thing to be making a movie where you are preaching and saying to people this is what you need to do. This is what you need to believe.

"We were so careful and,

that we are not telling people what to do. We are trying to portray a family in their moment of crisis and how faith helped them," she said.

Some movie releases come much closer to the faith-based tag.

"The Messiah" is aimed more at those who want faith-based movies because it looks at the early years of Jesus, a story based on a limited number of Scrip-

Then there is "God Is Not Dead 2," where religion is the driving force, even to the point of where it will be argued in a court case.

When it comes down to it, whether the movies are described as faith-based depends largely on how much the filmmakers are looking to preach outside the chorus.

First downtown art walk of 2016 in Bangor set for Friday

A cup of tea and a stout teapot, each adorned with a single purple flower, cozy up to a pot filled with bright blossoms that sing of spring. Needlework in progress nestled among a pile of white linens and a pair of glasses hide in the corner, awaiting their owner's return.

This still life, painted by Bangor artist Lois Gopin, is the first of its kind to be featured on a poster for the upcoming art walk in downtown Bangor. The Downtown Bangor Arts Collaborative's art walk will take place from 4 to 8 p.m. Friday, March 25, kicking off the first of four art walks scheduled for 2016.

Gopin, a new addition to the art walk, will be the featured artist for this art

"She's a new artist who contacted us about being a part of the art walk," Shane McCarthy, chair of the organization, said. "She does not have a studio in downtown. We've shown or fea-

tured different artists who have studios downtown, have become an integral but it's also nice to show an artist from the Bangor community who does not have a studio downtown."

The art walk takes place four Fridays this year: March 25, June 3, Sept. 16 and Nov. 18. It's the hope of the Downtown Bangor Arts Collaborative that the events will become more frequent in the future.

We want these art walks four times a year to get so popular that we can do them six times a year, eight times a year and eventually every month — that's the goal," McCarthy said.

The art walk originally was conceived to give exposure to local artists, especially those who have less accessible studios on upper floors in downtown Bangor. Over time the event has grown and changed, incorporating more of Bangor's artistic community, such as Divisi, a local choral group that previously performed during event, and a group called the Tango Bombers, who at various locadanced

Community murals also part of the art walk. Although there won't be one for the first art walk this year, participants can expect to see it in the future.

"Our goal has always been to grow this into a community art where artists work together to present their work and the community benefits by being exposed to that," McCarthy said. "The Downtown Bangor Arts Collaborative is just that: It's a downtown Bangor arts collaborative. We are trying to collaborate artists and art entities for the benefit of artists in the community.

He hopes these art walks achieve such prominence as those in other Maine destinations, such as Portland and Belfast

"Our community is a vibrant as any, but it's not as well known," McCarthy
