In 1962 he built the "Dairy Joy," now home of the "Fish Net." He really enjoyed being a Boy Scout leader during those

early years. Bob was a 59 year member of IRA Berry Lodge #128. In 1960 Bob bought his first race horse "Lady Oaks" and was hooked on harness racing from then on. He was an owner, trainer, and driver in Blue Hill.


