During her career at COM-BAT many will remember her as helping them with their consumer issues and her lengthy career writing the weekly "Consumer Forum" column for the Bangor Daily News.

In 1991 she and her best friend, Marcia Bond, went on their first cruise to the Caribbean and from that moment on Marian was bitten by the cruise bug. In 1993, while on a cruise, she met an officer on board named Sukanda and they traveled to many countries and islands, such as Gibraltar, Spain, Italy, Greece, Turkey and in the US -Hawaii and Alaska.
