

CARL E. MORRISON, SR.

BRADFORD & BANGOR -Carl E. Morrison, Sr., "Bill," passed away at his home in Bradford, February 27, 2016, surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Charleston, July 9, 1921, the son of Roland C. Morrison and Esffie (Judkins) Morri-

Bill graduated from Bradford High School in 1940. His career began at an early age. When he was 2 years old, he fired a bullet from a corkstopper gun. When he wasn't too pleased with the cork stoppers, he decided to use some of his father's old ammunition from his war days. Needless to say, after many pops from his toy gun, the ammunition went off! The bullet went up, hit the ceiling, cracked the plaster, and his mother let out an ungodly scream. Unfortunately, his beloved pop gun had been destroyed.

At the age of 15, when not working the dairy farm, Bill was happy to spend time at the local sporting goods store, which dealt in a wide range of firearms. Bill convinced the store management to allow him to try and repair the guns. In short order, the guns were repaired and returned to the store, ready to be sold. Young Bil-I's career began by the creation of Morrison's Gun Shop, which lasted for 76 years.

Bill was the first person in Maine to make his own barrels. He was known all over the world for his craftsmanship. Bill wasn't one to toot his own horn, but he was a tremendous marksman in his early days. In 1958, he headed to Camp Perry, Ohio for the annual shooting competition. He walked away with 8 medals, which was quite impressive at the time. His one and only vacation. He was instrumental in helping the police solve a 1964 double murder in Bangor. He also went to Texas to help authorities when JFK was assassinated.

Bill had a fantastic memory, even at 94. People would leave their guns to be repaired and forget about them. They would show up years later and he would know exactly where their gun was located in his vast



inventory.

Bill worked for the Penobscot County Sheriff's Office in his "spare" time. He was a lifetime member of the NRA and the American Rifle Association. He truly was the "Dean of Guns." As for retiring, he would say "They've got a box out there somewhere, I think."

Bill was predeceased by his wife of 69 years, Lena; a sister, Maxine; and a son in law, Ray. He is survived by his daughter, Eva Evans of East Corinth; son, Carl E. Morrison, Jr. and his wife, Kaye of Bald Knob, AR; his daughter, Gail (Morrison) Gary and her husband, Brent of Bonita Springs, FL; and Linda Morrison-Beck of Bangor: two sisters. Rod was an accountant who practiced in Houlton until three years ago and a lifelong musician. He is survived by his wife, Janice Robinson Palmer, and two children, Susan and her husband Daniel Haney, and Kent and his wife Dorothy Benn Palmer, as well as three grandsons, Joshua, Christopher and Nicholas Palmer, and four great-grandchil-

He grew up in Island Falls and graduated from Island Falls High School and Ricker Junior College. He began his career working for the Paul Jackins potato brokerage and started his private accounting and tax practice in Houlton in 1952. Rod represented clients before the Internal Revenue Service as an Enrolled Agent. He was a cofounder of Houlton's first cable television system and the Houlton Federal Credit Union.

Rod was an accomplished musician who played piano,

trumpet, flute and trombone. Starting at age 14 and through high school, he played with Ronald Martin's dance band in Island Falls. In the 1940s, he formed the Rodney Palmer Band, a jazz and swing combo that played throughout northern Maine at dance halls, proms, weddings and other events. He arranged music and played with other Houlton musicians throughout his life. He was the oldest member of McGill's Community Band, where he played trombone. He was an early member

of the Houlton Lions Club, a member of Monument Lodge of Masons, and a long -time member of the Houlton Rotary Club, which recognized him as a Paul Harris Fellow. Rod enjoyed going to camp at Nickerson Lake. He loved to sail, fly fish for trout and pick fiddleheads.

Rod is also survived by his brother, Malcolm, of Island Falls, and many nephews and nieces. He was predeceased by his sister, Maurine Emerson, and brother Kirk Palmer.
