After spending time in England, the family arrived in New York in 1940, settling in Rochester where Anitta graduated from high school and passed the New York Regents Exams despite speaking and writing English for only a few years.

Always independent, Anitta headed west, working and traveling in Colorado and California, where she made life-long friends. She settled in Colorado because she loved the mountains. She belonged to the Colorado Mountain Club for more than 60 years. She enjoyed hiking, snowshoeing and skiing adventures, but mostly the club's many eligible bachelors.

She married Truman Young on May 19, 1965, and the outdoor and railroad adventures continued.

She was proud of accomplishing many things "later in life," including learning to downhill ski, sew (she made her home's curtains), paint -- and having a child, by natural childbirth.

She was a long-time member of Artists by Design and the First Unitarian Church of Denver.
