where. Diane loved being outdoors, and was an avid fisherman with several favorite 'secret' fishing spots. Hunting was another favorite pastime, and more than once she bagged trophy deer, even winning the title of 5thlargest antlers in the state. She had a special place in her heart for animals, especially her two dogs, Helga, a Red-Tick Hound and Teddy, a Lab-Malamute mix. They were constantly by her side. She even kept a pet goat that accompanied her on car

trips, boat rides and home to Rockland for family gatherings. This same goat also served as a 'guard goat' at her home.

She loved helping others, and was willing to do anything for someone in need. Her house was always open with a place to stay, whether it was for a night or a year; she often had a house full of her son's friends whom she loved like her own.
