2 baby deaths lead to discovery of potentially fatal bacteria at hospital

The recent deaths of two babies at a suburban Washington hospital led to the discovery of a potentially deadly bacteria in the neonatal intensive care unit, according to two individuals with direct knowledge of the situ-

Three babies have tested positive for the Pseudomonas bacteria since the investigation began, said Delores Butler, a spokeswoman for Dimension Healthcare Systems, the nonprofit that runs hospitals in Prince George's County, Maryland.

Nine babies have been transferred from the NICU at Prince George's County Hospital Center in Cheverly, to other hospitals in the region "out of an abundance of caution," Butler said.

The presence of the bacteria, and the closing of the NICU, was first reported by a local Washington TV station.

While Butler would not confirm that two infants had died, the two individuals with direct knowledge of the situation said Dimensions Healthcare board members were notified on Sunday that the deaths had triggered an investigation into the source

of the germ. Although Pseudomonas was cultured in the water pipes near the neonatal intensive care unit, these two people said, health officials so far have not determined

any direct link between the water-borne bacteria and the infant deaths.

A spokeswoman for the University of Maryland Medical System, which works with Dimensions to operate the hospital center, emphasized that the babies who tested positive for the bacteria have not shown any symptoms of Pseudomonas, which can be mild in healthy individuals but far more serious for those with compromised immune systems.

There has been no causal link between any deaths and this bacteria," said the spokeswoman, Karen Lancaster. "Those babies who tested positive have not had any symptoms of Pseudomonas. These three patients that have been positively identified to be carrying the bacteria do not have symptoms.'

Officials do not yet know where exactly the bacteria is located within the pipe system and plumbing, said the two individuals with direct knowledge of this situation, both of whom spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to speak to reporters.

Pseudomonas is a naturally occurring germ that is aggressive and can be difficult to treat, these individuals

All water in and out of the hospital will be tested several times and decontaminated before the NICU unit can be reopened, they said.
