She was stationed for one year in Reykjavik, Iceland when she volunteered for an AF program to see how women coped in isolated areas. She left the WAF in 1954 then enlisted in the hardest AF position - that of a military wife after marrying Joseph Rump in 1955. For the next 15 years the family lived at several AF bases throughout the U.S. where Gay enrolled in college courses to continue her love of learning. When Joe retired from the AF the family moved to Maine. Gay went back to school to become a nurse's aide - a job she enjoyed for several years. At age 60 she was hired to work at Farmers Home Administration. Retirement didn't slow her down because volunteering was a big part of Gay's life - helping with many military related organizations including at Bangor's Veterans Home, as well as local Girl Scouts and Friends of Fort Knox. Her interests included researching her genealogy and she was a lifetime member of The John Clough Genealogical Society. She was a voracious reader, especially of mysteries, and enjoyed a good action movie. She loved gardening and eating the fruits of her labor. 
JAMES R. BERRY


LEONA CHRISTINE MARIE WARREN
