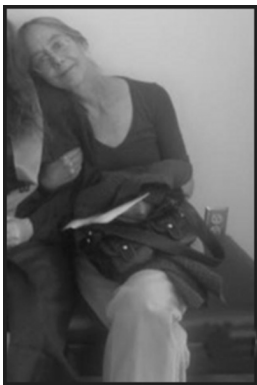


OBITUARIES

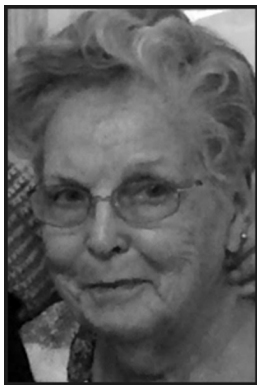
VIRGINIA (HEWINS) HUGHES

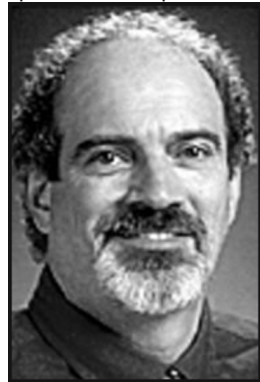
