## Lois Stackpole to be honored

ROCKLAND — A celebration of nearly 50 years of the Meals on Wheels program, with a special emphasis on the faithful work of nutrition director Lois Stackpole-Alley, will be held from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 25, at Rockland Aldersgate United Methodist Church, Route 17.

Pratt Memorial United Methodist Church, now Wyeth Center, the parent congregation of Aldersgate UMC, started Meals on Wheels in Knox County out of concern that homebound seniors should receive proper nutrition. Meals initially were served weekdays at the church and later delivered by volunteer drivers.

Within a short time, the program grew and meal preparation moved to the kitchen of the newly constructed Methodist Conference Home on Summer Street under Lois Stackpole-Alley's supervision.

Stackpole-Alley has shepherded the program over the past five decades by connecting directly with each client, often recognizing individual voices on the phone. Until recently, she also coordinated the hundreds of volunteers needed to deliver the meals to homes throughout Knox County.

In the current program, meals are delivered to 208 individuals five days each week by a team of 75 volunteers. The Meals on Wheels program will continue under the auspices of the Making Community Happen staff. An expanded kitchen, under construction, will be named for Stackpole-Alley.

Past and present drivers, family members, meal recipients and community members are invited on Sept. 25 to celebrate the program and the woman whose lifelong dedication has made it possible.
