Drafted into the U.S. Army on October 31, 1944, Pat served in the Pacific Theater with the 7th Army 13th Tank Battalion, commanding a fleet of fourteen tanks and reaching the rank of tech sergeant. After his honorable discharge on November 30, 1946, Pat returned to St. Francis; working as an independent trucker for many years. After his trucking retirement in 1977, Pat also worked as a skidder operator, woods chopper, woods boss, and at several community odd jobs.

Pat enjoyed the outdoors; snowmobiling, four wheeling, and had a passion for horses, of which he owned several over the years. Liliane's flawless English was spoken with a lovely lilt, and her full name itself is like a melody: Liliane Jacqueline Angèle Olga Aperlo Kell. Her life was filled with many friends and multiple interests and pursuits, but most important to her was her family. She was above all a loving and devoted wife, mother, and grandmother. She created a beautiful home and garden for them, was a wonderful cook, and delighted in sewing and knitting clothing for her children and grandchildren. She was active in the local French group, an avid member of a tennis group with whom she continued to play weekly as recently as five months ago, and served for several years as a member of the board of trustees of The Grand. She maintained close ties with her family in France, and with her husband traveled extensively in Europe and the Far East.

Liliane was an accomplished artist in many styles and media: calligraphy, book making, decorative paper making, painting, and sewing. She studied with some of the best calligraphers in the country, and was known for her flower

painting and color palette, with her remarkable sense of color and design showing the influence of her early life in southern France. In her typically generous fashion, she always shared her skills with others, teaching a monthly art class in her studio for over 20 years. Her own art was often on exhibit locally, and she leaves behind a body of work that her family and friends will treasure.

Liliane showed grace in her dealings with people and was a devoted friend to many who will miss her greatly. Most of all she will be missed by her family, especially her grandchildren, with whom she shared many hours and special activities.

## Kirrane, captain of 1960 US hockey team, dies at 88

John "Jack" Kirrane Jr., the captain of the United States' gold medal-winning hockey team in the 1960 Winter Olympics, has died. He was 88.

Kirrane reportedly died due to complications from Alzheimer's disease. The Brooklyn, Massachusetts, native died Sunday at a care facility in Quincy.

Kirrane was a 31-year-old defenseman when the U.S. surprisingly won the gold medal in the 1960 Games at Squaw Valley. It marked the

first time the Americans won gold in Olympic hockey competition.

The squad became the first U.S. team to defeat the Soviet Union when it posted a 3-2 victory to reach the final. In the gold-medal game, the Americans rolled to a 9-4 victory over Czechoslovakia. It took 20 years for the United States to win the gold again when the famed "Miracle on Ice" group won at Lake Placid, New York.

Kirrane also played in the 1948 Olympics and is a member of the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.

## Driver death in Malaysia adds to Takata air bag fatalities

Honda said a driver died after a Takata air bag ruptured during a crash last week in Malaysia, lifting the number of fatalities tied to the devices to at least 16 worldwide.

The driver's 2009 Honda City had been recalled in July 2015 and a repair was never completed, Honda's Malaysia unit said in an e-mailed statement. Honda confirmed the air bag ruptured with police, though an official cause of death hasn't been determined, the company said.

The death was the fourth

in Malaysia this year involving Takata air bags built with inflators prone to spraying metal and plastic shards at vehicle occupants. The Tokyo-based supplier of auto safety devices is seeking buyers amid global recalls that could exceed 100 million air bags, the biggest safety crisis in the industry's history.
