
eling, such as cruising in omy, 58, beloved mother Alaska and Bermuda, and visiting Puerto Rico.

BANGOR - Emile Albert Amnotte, 94, died on Nov. 24, 2015, at the Maine Veterans' Home in Bangor. He was born April

14, 1921 in Biddeford, the eldest son of Emile and Yvonne (Descoteaux) Amnotte. At Biddeford High School Emile was elected captain of both the baseball and the basketball teams, earning the nickname, "Cappy.

After graduation, he enlisted and served in the U.S. Coast Guard Amphibious Force during World War II. Emile won 3 battle stars for his action in the invasions of Salerno and Anzio, Italy, and Normandy, France. For his participation at Normandy he received a letter of commendation from the captain of his landing ship tank (LST).
