Pete also spent many happy hours reading countless books in a variety of genres, with David McCullough being his favorite author.

Pete was fond of the East Coast. He lived in New Jer-

on Long Beach Island, NJ. After settling in Maine in 1988, he spent summers at "the island" - a favorite family spot. He won the hearts of Kim's family with his neverending desire to chop wood! A quiet and private man,
