BANGOR - On August 1st, 2016, I lost the love of my life, my very best friend, my husband, my soul mate, the father of our children, and Grampy to our grandchildren, great-grandchildren and bonus greats. Norman J. Morneault, 85, died at a local healthcare facility after every effort was made to save him. God called Norman home, and with aching hearts we had to let him go.

Norman was born February 4, 1931, in Eagle Lake, to Louis and Clarina (Guimond) Morneault. He moved to Bangor at the age of 12. Norman's father died when Norman was 6 years of age, and his mother remarried. Harry McNally was the best stepfather ever.

Norman attended 5th Street Junior High and then Bangor High School where he was a varsity football player before graduating as an honor student in 1950. Norman had to struggle to learn the English language as he was born to French Canadian parents. English was not the 1st language in his home. He served in the U.S. Army from May of 1952 to April of 1954.

On October 18, 1952, I married my high school sweetheart. Following his return home from England, he worked for many years as a milkman for Footman's Dairy. In May of 1968, he started his own business, Morneault's Service Center. Norman never met an engine he couldn't fix (well, some came in DOA). Norman's business began to suffer after his first stroke in 2004 and was eventually closed on February 14, 2016.

There is not enough space to list all of the wonderful things Norman accomplished. In short, he was a talented carpenter, and a master oil burner technician. He was a Senior Little League baseball coach. He loved fishing, especially ice fishing.

Just before his passing, we were searching for just the right home on the ocean in Jonesport. Norman's last month was full of joy and excitement as he found one beautiful home with a barn to die for. Living on the ocean would have been a dream come true for both of us. In fact, Norman was baptized in the cool waters of the Atlantic Ocean at Lamoine State Park on July 4th, 2013, in the precious name of Jesus by Rev. Wade Townley of the First Apostolic Church in Brewer.

Most recently, we were attending Calvary Apostolic Church in Hampden.

Norman and I exchanged so many love letters while he was stationed in Germany and England and I was here in Bangor. We were

Former Queen Anne of Romania dies at 92

BUCHAREST — Former Queen Anne of Romania died on Monday in a Swiss hospital at the age of 92, the royal house said in a statement.

Anne and her husband, former King Michael of Romania, have been living in Aubonne, Switzerland, since 2004, visiting Romania during the holidays and for official functions. They had been married for 68 years.

Earlier this year, the royal house said Michael, who is 94, has withdrawn from public life because of illness after undergoing surgery for leukemia and cancer.

Michael, a cousin of Britain's Queen Elizabeth and a descendant of Germany's old Hohenzollern dynasty, was forced to abdicate in 1947 after the post-war Communist takeover of Romania. He lived in exile in the West for decades, returning to Romania in 1992.

He and Anne married in 1948 in Athens. They have five daughters. She was born in Paris and belongs to the house

of Bourbon-Parma. Anne died at the hospital surrounded by family, the royal house statement read. The funeral will take place in the central Romanian city of Curtea de Arges.

While there is no popular demand for a restoration of the European Union state's monarchy, Romanians widely respect Michael and Anne as historic figureheads especially as they have grown increasingly disillusioned with a political class perceived as corrupt.
