**FREDERICK C. EMERY JR.**

CAPE ELIZABETH - Frederick C. Emery, Jr. of Cape Elizabeth, ME, died on September 4, 2015, at Gorham House, Gorham, ME, after a gallant and courageous battle with ALS. He was born on November 7, 1947, in Bangor, ME, the oldest son of Dr. Frederick C. and Mary M. Emery, who predeceased him.

Rick graduated from Bangor High School in 1965, and from Colby College in 1969, then served in the United States Army for two years. He graduated from Cornell Law School in 1974. Rick began his legal career as a law clerk for Judge John F. O'Mara in Rochester, NY. In 1975, he joined the Monroe County Public Defender's Office in Rochester, then moved to the US Attorney's Office for the Western District of New York in 1982. In 1989, he returned to Maine as an Assistant US Attorney for the District of Maine in Portland, where he remained until his retirement in 2012. During his career, he was involved in many areas of prosecution for the Federal government, among them drug enforcement, fraud, tax evasion, and bankruptcy.

Rick was a lifelong amateur athlete, playing varsity sports in high school and college, competing in softball leagues in Portland, and coaching baseball teams in Cape Elizabeth. He loved exploring the Maine coast, particularly the Mount Desert area, and was a generous, long term supporter of Friends of Acadia. He was also a faithful supporter of the Portland Symphony Orchestra, attending the Tuesday Night Classical concerts for many years. Another of his favorite pastimes was dining at the many fine restaurants through the state.

Rick was a courteous, traditional gentleman who insisted on holding doors for any woman he encountered. He loved his home, and was a warm and gracious host to family and friends. He was supremely organized, with meticulous attention to detail, and was renowned for the thoroughness of both his professional and personal records. He was equally meticulous in the care of his home landscape.



He then went to the University of Denver and received his Master's degree in Public Management. They traveled to Kansas City, MO where Don was an intern in the City Manager office for a year, then back to Maine to be Town Manager of Waldoboro for 3 years. 
Bruce was predeceased by his parents, and a sister, Susan Noecher.

**REV. DR. ROBERT L. VEON, M.DIV., D.D., D.MIN.**

ETNA - Rev. Dr. Robert L. Veon, M.Div., D.D., D.Min., 80, died September 8, 2015 after an extended illness. Born March 12, 1935 in New Castle, PA, he was the son of George and Mina (Johnston) Veon.

Dr. Veon attended Westminster College, (BA '57; Honorary Doctor of Divinity '75) Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, (M.Div. '61; D. Min. '96) and completed post-graduate studies at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He was a Visiting Fellow at Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey where he participated in Princeton Seminary's Teaching Church mentoring many theological students in field education. He was a Visiting Scholar at Union Theological Seminary in New York. He was actively pursuing an MS in Psychology at Husson University in Bangor until the spring of 2015 when his health required that he discontinue those studies.

Dr. Veon, an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA), served congregations in New Castle, PA as a student, then as senior pastor in Clarksville, AR, Grove City, PA, Erie, PA, Had-donfield, NJ, Dayton, OH, and, New Canaan, CT. He moved to Maine where he was currently the pastor of the UCC congregations at Union Evangelical Church in Greenville and Rockwood Community Chapel in the Maine Moosehead Lake region. He supplied the pulpit at Jackman for about 1 year.

Dr. Veon served as athletic director at Greenville High School in 1996 and 1997. He loved teaching and interacting with students. He taught Ethics, Critical Thinking, Human Behavior in Contemporary Film, and World Religions at Beal College in Bangor and at Kennebec Valley Community College in Fairfield. His special areas of interest included Biblical studies and the Gospel of John, Positive Psychology and Gerontology/Aging. Dr. Veon loved preaching and studied homiletics his entire adult life. A man of creativity, enthusiasm, a joy for living and teaching others about the faith, Dr. Veon generated thousands of inspirational poems intended to celebrate life in weekly columns in the newsletters of the congregations he served. He was the author of Living on the Growing Edge, '86 and Seeing With The Heart, '14.

He served on numerous boards during his career most recently the Eastern Area Agency on Aging. He was honored by the United States Marine Corps as their "Outstanding Spokesman of the Faith" at Camp Quantico, Virginia in 1981. He loved to travel with Susan, reading, collecting books, gardening, his golden retrievers Alice and Sally, and spending time at his home "Kairos Cove" on Greenwood Pond near Eliotsville.

Dr. Veon is survived by his wife of 28 and 1/2 years, Susan Jean Michel-Veon of Etna, who was his loving partner, soul mate, and caregiver; his children, Candace Veon-Nyiri and husband Louis of Gettysburg, PA, Robert T. Veon and wife Deborah of Texarkana, AR, Scott C.
