Looking for adventure, Jim traveled to Texas during the shrimp hey day. He then traveled to Florida and purchased his own fishing party boat to do salvage work, bringing up many treasures. In 1960 his love of the sea took him to Cape May, New Jersey, where he met his beloved wife, Ramona. Jim and Ramona raised 2 daughters Kathleen and Marie. In 1972 they lost their daughter Kathleen suddenly to a brain aneurysm and in 1975 they moved to Cooper, Maine to be close with their daughter Marie. From 1976 to 1998 Jim happily drove his grandchildren and neighbors on the Cooper school bus. His wife suffered a devastating stroke which left Ramona paralyzed. Jim took loving care of her until her death in 2000. Jim continued his compassionate care-giving work through volunteering at the senior companions. He received the governor's special volunteer award in 2009. Through the years Jim continued to love hunting and fishing, sailing, long walks, family gatherings, and helping out at Wild Blueberry Land and the family farm in Addison. 
