
## **OBITUARIES**



## Betty Jean Thiebaud, wife of painter Wayne Thiebaud, dies

Betty Jean Thiebaud, a filmmaker and teacher and the wife of renowned Sacra-

mento-based painter Wayne Thiebaud, died Saturday afternoon. She was 86. Thiebaud passed away at

the couple's Land Park home after a long battle with Alzheimer's, said her artist son Matt Bult. She's survived by her 95-year-old husband, two sons and four grandchildren.

Born Betty Jean Carr, she was a native of Shell Knob, Missouri, and met Wayne Thiebaud in the mid-1950s. They married in 1959, moved to the Sacramento County community of Hood and then the muse for her husband's to their current home in 1971. oil and acrylic paintings.

She taught elementary school in Lodi before becoming an avid filmmaker in the late 1960s, going on to make 11 independent short films, said Bult, her son from a previous marriage.
