As the team competed around the state, the opposing teams could often be heard saying 'watch out for number #1.' This last spring season, during his battle with cancer, he was proud to be named the attack coach and attended as many practices and games as he could.

Jonathan was a member of Troop 404 Boy Scouts serving as patrol leader for several years. He also enjoyed participating in the Trek Across Maine, raising funds for the American Lung Association, and he was an avid outdoorsman and skier. Obviously, he was a young man headed for great things.

Jonny is survived by his parents Kevin and Susan, and sister Abigail Bowman, all of St. Albans; paternal grandparents Ethelyn and Philip Bowman of St. Albans; and many aunts, uncles, beloved cousins, and friends.

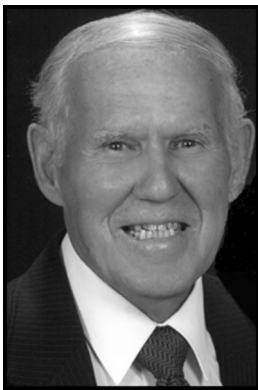
FREDERICK R. LYFORD
