Bangor Savings opens 54th branch

BRUNSWICK — Built on the site of a former landmark building in downtown Brunswick, the newest branch of Bangor Savings Bank opened Monday morning.

The branch is the final project in a \$10 million expansion by Bangor Savings into Cumberland and York counties, following the June 6 opening of a branch on Marginal Way in Portland.

Agnes Maynard of Brunswick was the Brunswick branch's first customer on Monday, 82 years after she was born in an original house on one of two lots that now house the new bank at the corner of Maine and Mason streets, according to branch manager Niki Morton.

Maynard gave the bank photos of the building taken over the years through April 2011, when the previous 2½-story Greek Revival-style structure was destroyed in a three-alarm blaze. The lots were cleared and then remained vacant until they were purchased by Bangor Savings in November, according to town re-

The full-service Brunswick branch, which is Bangor Savings Bank's 54th office, includes a commercial loan officer and a mortgage development officer among its eight employees, according to Morton, who originally is from Topsham.

Two other employees, Sue Wixom and Michelle Richardson, of Topsham and Freeport, respectively, previously worked in the Augusta branch and relocated to the Brunswick location.

Wall Street sets records, led by tech, bank stocks

Wall Street closed slightly higher on Monday to mint new record highs for the S&P 500 and the Dow industrials, fueled by Bank of America's better-than-expected profit and a major tech sector acquisition.

SoftBank's \$32-billion deal to buy British chip designer ARM Holdings lifted U.S. chip stocks, and the technology sector led the way higher on the S&P 500. The tech-heavy Nasdaq rose more than the S&P and the Dow.

Bank of America's earnings report continued the momentum for U.S. banks, kicked off by JPMorgan last week. The bank's shares rose 3.3 percent to \$14.11, helping the S&P financial index gain 0.4 percent.

"The underlying catalyst is a breakout in economic optimism, said Jim Paulsen, chief investment strategist at Wells Capital Management in Minneapolis.

"What's really important is people are revising up their earnings numbers. You see more cyclical (sectors) taking over leadership and less of the bond-like stocks.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 16.5 points, or 0.09 percent, to 18,533.05, for its seventh consecutive up day. The S&P 500 gained 5.15 points, or 0.24 percent, to 2,166.89 and the Nasdaq Composite added 26.20 points, or 0.52 percent, to 5,055.78.

The year-on-year decline in earnings of S&P 500 components is now expected to slow to 4.5 percent in the second quarter, from 5 percent in the first, and more companies are expected to beat analysts' estimates, according to Thomson Reuters data.

Third-quarter earnings are then expected to turn positive, rising 1.5 percent, with fourth-quarter profit up a more robust 9.1 percent.

"There seems to be a growing consensus that this is the trough of earnings for the S&P 500," said Bucky Hellwig, senior vice president at BB&T Wealth Management in Birmingham, Alabama. "If indeed it is, that can build some momentum on a fundamental basis going into the third and the fourth quarter."

The S&P 500 and Dow set new records last week for the first time in more than a year, shaking off global economic uncertainty including Britain's recent vote to
