Mall manager says retailer's departure at end of month 'not unexpected'

BANGOR - New York & Company will close its doors at the Bangor Mall by the end of the month when the women's clothing store's lease expires, mall General Manag-

er James Gerety said Friday. Gerety described the closing as part of the lease expiration but also part of the typical nationwide

trends that retail chains encounter. This is a natural closing. It was not unexpected," Gerety said Friday.

New York & Company describes itself as catering to women looking for moderately priced jeans, dresses, sunglasses, jewelry, handbags and hosiery. The company sells its

Its company representatives did not immediately return messages left on Friday.

Gerety said mall owners have no immediate plans to fill the space the store will vacate but "are looking for new concepts both local and national.

The closure will join several others at the mall over the last few months. The Bangor Mall Hallmark will consolidate with the other Hallmark store in the city at the Broadway Shopping Center at the end of the month, its owners have said

Chipotle Mexican Grill Inc. will close all of its U.S. stores for part of the day Feb. 8 while its employees attend a national team meeting, a company spokesman said Friday.

The meeting will discuss foodsafety changes, allow employees to ask questions and thank them for their "hard work during this difficult time," Chipotle spokesman Chris Arnold said in an email.

Stores will open at 3 p.m. local time that day, he said.

# to close 269 stores globally

Maine not affected by restructuring

Wal-Mart Stores Inc. said Friday it was pulling the plug on its smallest store format, Wal-Mart Express, and closing 269 locations globally, including 154 in the United States, in a restructuring that will affect 16,000 workers.

Wal-Mart, the world's largest retailer, will not close any of its stores in Maine, according to a list the company published Friday afternoon.

The company said the move would reduce diluted earnings per share by 20 cents to 22 cents, with nearly all of that to be booked in the

fourth quarter ending this month. The announcement comes three months after CEO Doug McMillon signaled to investors he was planning to review the retailer's global operations and shut underperforming stores. Friday's announcement marks the first step in that restructuring effort.

Wal-Mart said it planned to close 102 of its Express format stores, which at 12,000 to 15,000 square feet are less than one-tenth the size of a typical Supercenter. The format had been in pilot since 2011 but did not deliver the desired results.

The other 52 U.S. stores are a mixture of Supercenters, Wal-Mart's largest format; discount stores; a grocery format called Neighborhood Market and Sam's Club, its bulk-selling wholesale chain.

"Actively managing our portfolio of assets is essential to maintaining a healthy business," McMillon said in a release. "Closing stores is never an easy decision, but it is necessary to keep the company strong and positioned for the future.'

Wal-Mart said it was closing 115 stores internationally, with 60 coming from Brazil and the balance mainly smaller, money-losing locations in other Latin American countries. Reuters reported the Brazil closings Thursday.

### Steep losses on Wall St.; China fears deepen

Wall Street bled on Friday, with the S&P 500 sinking to its lowest level since October 2014 as oil prices sank below \$30 per barrel and fears grew about economic trouble in China.

Pain was dealt widely, with the day's trading volume unusually high and more than a fifth of S&P 500 stocks touching 52-week lows. The major S&P sectors all ended sharply lower. The Russell 2000 small-cap index dropped as much as 3.5 percent to its lowest level since July 2013.

The energy sector dropped 2.87 percent as oil prices fell 6.5 percent, in part due to fears of slow economic growth in China, where major stock indexes also slumped overnight. The energy sector has lost nearly half of its value after hitting record highs in late 2014.

"Initially when oil was down, the convenient line was 'Well, it's good for the other nine sectors, said Jake Dollarhide, chief executive officer of Longbow Asset Management in Tulsa, Oklahoma. "That tune has changed. Now, it's a contagion to the other nine sectors. It's a contagion to Main Street and Wall Street."

The technology sector was the day's biggest loser, sliding 3.15 percent as weak quarterly results from chipmaker Intel weighed heavily on chip stocks.

The S&P 500 has fallen about 12 percent from its high in May, pushing it into what is generally considered "correction territory."

China's major stock indexes shed over 3 percent, raising questions about Beijing's ability to halt a selloff that has now reached 18 percent since the beginning of the year.

The Dow Jones industrial average dropped 2.39 percent to end at 15,988.08 points and the S&P 500 fell 2.16 percent to 1,880.29.

The Nasdaq Composite lost 2.74 percent to 4,488.42.

For the week, the Dow fell 2.2 percent, the S&P 500 lost 2.2 percent and the Nasdaq dropped 3.3 percent.
