

# Iron anemia brings suspicion of cancer

**Dear Dr. Roach:** I recently went for an annual checkup, and was told that I am anemic. Other than advising me to take iron pills, I was told to see my gastroenterologist. Upon seeing him and advising him that I'm feeling fine, he wanted to schedule me for a colonoscopy and an endoscopy. I've had these procedures before, most recently in 2010. Do you think I need to have them done now? I'm 70 and have not experienced any pain or esophageal problems at all. Does this relate to my being anemic? — C.A.

It sounds like you have iron deficiency anemia, though it's important to be sure of that. Iron deficiency can come from excessive loss or inadequate intake. All cases of iron deficiency anemia should trigger unless there is another known then it should be considered.

TO YOUR GOOD HEALTH

You definitely should have a colonoscopy. Six years is enough time for a polyp to develop that's large enough to bleed and become precancerous or even cancerous.

If the colonoscopy does not show a source of bleeding, it is appropriate to look for other sources, such as from the upper GI tract via an upper endoscopy.

Increasing dietary iron or taking a supplement may be appropriate, but ask your gastroenterologist when to stop before the colonoscopy.

## Number challenges

At the second trick West shifted to the jack of hearts: king, ace, deuce. Louie won the heart return and drew trumps. He next took the ace of diamonds and led to his jack. The finesse won, but when Louie took the king, West discarded. East got his queen, and Louie went down.

### LOW DOUBLETON

Louie's diamond play was mathematically challenged. Louie would gain when West had the singleton queen but lose when he had any low doubleton.

Louie should lead a diamond to his jack at Trick Four. He draws trumps, goes to the ace of diamonds and returns a diamond to his ten to land the contract.


