

# Metformin as an extender of longevity

Dear Dr. Roach: I am a healthy 90-year-old woman. I enjoy playing tennis and bridge.

A week ago, I started to take the drug metformin. I do not have diabetes. The reason for taking it is that I read an article about it by an expert in longevity.

My only concern is that the drug may lower my sugar level to a dangerous point.

I also have read about the use of metformin as a possible extender of longevity, and have looked at two different study designs that hope to determine whether the medication can affect the aging process. It certainly would be exciting if that were the case.

However, I don't recommend taking the medication as metformin has several possible side effects.

It may cause nausea and

GI upset. It may indeed lower blood sugar, which seems to happen far more often than it is supposed to, in my experience using it in people with mild diabetes.

My guess is that you are more likely to improve your length and quality of life with your tennis and bridge than with metformin, but I would love to see metformin proven effective.
