Dollar General revives Thomaston plan

THOMASTON — Dollar Generto build a store along Route 1 in this Midcoast town.

The Thomaston Planning Board has scheduled a meeting for 6 p.m. Tuesday at Watts Hall to review the application by Franklin Land Associates LLC of Brentwood, Tennessee for the retail store.

However, the town's code enforcement officer, William Wasson, said Thursday he does not believe the layout of the proposed 9,100-square-foot store meets the town standards. One of the major reasons is because the building is situated perpendicular to Route 1, the code officer said.

The town requirements for the Thomaston Green design guidelines requires retail stores to be parallel to Route 1 with landscaping in front and parking in the rear. In addition, the entrance needs to be from a side street and

not from Route 1, as Dollar General proposes, he said.

In February, the planning board rejected Dollar General's al has not surrendered its attempt original proposal, saying the project failed to meet local zoning standards. The planning board meeting attracted about 60 residents, many of whom were concerned about the design of the project not fitting in with the vision the community had for development in the area.

The aim of the Thomaston Green design guidelines is to make buildings look as though they belong in a New England village green and complement development in the abutting residential

"Franchise architecture, which is designed to be identified with a specific commercial chain store or restaurant, is not appropriate," the town ordinance states.

Wasson said Thursday the new design offered by Dollar General is New England style.

The project is on a 2.6-acre parclosed in 2002, and the buildings

cel, next to where the Strong Agency insurance building is located, owned by Jlinn LLC, which in-

cludes John Miller of Thomaston. Thomaston Green includes the area where the former Maine State Prison was located. The property runs along Route 1 and overlooks the St. George River. The prison

were demolished.

The town has tried to encourage developers to build homes on the site, but the Great Recession that struck in 2008 dampened interest.

Dollar General has more than 12,000 stores in 43 states, according to the company's website. Its 12 stores in Maine are concentrated in central and southern Maine.

US, Canada locked in lumber dispute

OTTAWA — Talks between the United States and Canada on a long-running dispute over softwood lumber exports have bogged down amid "significant differences," the two nations said on Friday, potentially paving the way for a fresh round of lawsuits.

U.S. producers complain that Canadian lumber is subsidized, and have in the past launched trade challenges that resulted in the United States imposing billion of dollars in tariffs.

The most recent round of arguments ended with a 2006 deal that expired in October 2015. Both sides agreed to take no action for a year after that, but without a new treaty, U.S. firms have made clear they will file new damage claims.

In March, President Barack Obama and Prime Minister Justin Trudeau asked officials to work out possible solutions and report back within 100 days. That deadline runs out on June 18.

"Significant differences remain between us," said U.S. Trade Representative Michael Froman and Canadian Trade Minister Chrystia Freeland in a joint statement.

"The United States and Canada have made significant advances in exploring the key issues and priorities ...(and) are committed to continuing negotiations.'

Reuters reported on June 10 that the talks were making little progress. Canadian officials say one challenge is that domestic producers are split over the best strat-

A compromise could let you ditch your cable box

For weeks, cable providers such as Comcast have been resisting a federal proposal that would force them to make their channels available to anybody who wanted to design new user interfaces for them. Instead of browsing the channel lineup through cable-provided menus and devices, consumers should have access to a greater variety of choices, argue the regulators who proposed the move.

hopes will keep away the toughest also be able to access Netflix-style providers' own channel lineups of the regulations proposed by the Federal Communications Commission. In meetings with top agency officials this week, representatives from Comcast, AT&T and a slew of industry organizations offered a compromise. The deal would allow consumers to get rid of their set-top boxes altogether, saving the roughly \$230 a year on average that households pay for the box.

Through an app designed by your cable company, you would be able to search and view all kinds of content not limited to your regular with a counterproposal that it cable lineup; instead, you would

streaming video content right from the same app. Consumer advocates say this form of integrated search that unifies cable and streaming programming benefits consumers.

The app would be designed using open HTML5 standards, meaning that start-ups and businesses that sell smart TVs or other hardware could begin supporting the app without having to jump through hoops trying to meld with proprietary cable technology. But the user interface would have the same look and feel of the cable and menus.

'This approach would provide significant benefits to consumers," the industry officials argued to three of the FCC's commissioners this week in a regulatory filing shown to The Washington Post.

The cable industry's proposal also includes intellectual property safeguards built in to prevent piracy one of the primary objections the industry had to the FCC's proposed rules. Every cable and satellite company with over 1 million subscribers would have to offer such an app, if the idea is approved.

Wall St. ends on down note as Apple falls

Wall Street ended lower on Friday as Apple dragged down major indexes and investors girded for Britain's vote next week on its European Union membership.

For the week, the three indexes

vote to leave the EU on June 23 has been rattling global markets. U.S. stock markets could see heavy trading and increased volatility as investors position for next week's referendum.

"I don't think we're going to escape this until Thursday," said Jim Paulsen, chief investment strategist at Wells Capital Management in Minneapolis. "We're just going to be tied to those anxieties going up or down between now and the Thursday vote."

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 57.94 points, or 0.33 percent, to 17,675.16, and the S&P 500 lost 6.77 points, or 0.33 percent, to 2,071.22

The tech-heavy Nasdaq Composite dropped 44.58 points, or 0.92 percent, to 4,800.34.

Apple shares fell 2.3 percent. Apple said its iPhone 6 and 6 Plus were still available for sale in China after Beijing's intellectual property regulators barred sales, saying the designs had infringed a Chinese company's patent.

"There seems to be this perpetual stream of kind of quasi-negative news surrounding some of the really big market cap stocks, like Apple particularly, and anytime you have got Apple misbehaving that tends to put a damper on the averages," said Chuck Carlson, chief executive officer at Horizon Investment Services in Hammond, Indiana.

Fears over Brexit undercut the S&P 500's momentum after the benchmark index came within about 12 points of its record closing high last week. On Thursday, Wall Street had snapped a fivesession streak of declines.

"Risk appetite has declined because of the Brexit vote," said Jeremy Zirin, head of investment strategy at UBS Wealth Management Americas in New York.

On Friday, five of the 10 S&P sectors ended lower. Energy shares were the best-performing group, gaining 0.8 percent, as oil prices jumped.

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
