

Therefore, they should be prescribed only by those very familiar with their use. Methotrexate, for example, is commonly used as cancer chemotherapy. It has found use in several autoimmune diseases at lower doses, but I am not familiar enough to comfortably prescribe it (or many other RA drugs), since patients to a rheumatologist I don't do so frequently. It has only one ace, no long suit to serve as a source of tricks and no promising spot cards. Personally, I might have opened 1NT even with a 15-to-17 range.
