PORTLAND — An Orono-based firm using nanotechnology to make ceramic filters has gained a spot in a 12-week Silicon Valley program that the company's founder hopes will allow it to get a foot in the door with investors and potential clients around the world.

Cerahelix said in a news release that it will take part in a program to help early-stage businesses get off the ground at Plug and Play Ventures in Sunnyvale, California.

pany's founder and CEO, said in a from Maine to California, but it is there, 20 are selected to pitch their news release that admission to the program comes at an opportune time, as the company is seeking out other companies to pilot its ceramic filters.

It claims the product can filter water three times faster and remove particles 10 times smaller than competing ceramic filters, with applications in a range of industries where it claims it can help reduce waste in the manufacturing process. It has a patent on its technology for using DNA to create its ceramic filters.

"It seems like a long way to go

worth the trip because Plug and Play brings people from all over the world into their tech center,'

MacKay said in a news release. She said the program will help make connections with potential participants for its pilot program and set up meetings with potential investors, too. Plug and Play itself invests in more than 100 businesses a year, according to the statement from Cerahelix.

The 5-year-old Orono startup was selected from more than 100 companies nominated by the program's corporate partners. From concepts, and a smaller group is selected to come back for the 12week program.

For Cerahelix, based in Orono's business incubator called the Target Technology Center, MacKay said the program will give it an immediate reach beyond the East Coast as it works to bring its product to market.

"This gives us a chance to reach beyond the East Coast — their network is global," MacKay said.

Cerahelix will take part in the business accelerator program from July 28 through Oct. 26.

Feds ask companies to provide 'robocall' blocking

WASHINGTON — The chairman of the Federal Communications Commission on Friday pressed major U.S. phone companies to take immediate steps to make technology that blocks unwanted automated calls available

to consumers at no charge. FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler, in letters to CEOs of major phone companies, said so-called robocalls, automated pre-recorded telephone calls often from telemarketers or scam artists, continue "due in large part to industry inaction.'

Wheeler's letters went to chief executives of companies including Verizon Communications Inc., AT&T Inc., Sprint Corp., US Cellular Corp., Level 3 Communications Inc., Frontier Communications Corp., Bandwidth.com Inc., and T-Mobile US.

Friday that he wants answers from the companies "within 30 days with their concrete, actionable solutions to address these issues.

The letters, reviewed by Reuters, noted that the FCC does not require phone providers to offer robocall blocking and filtering but the FCC has "strongly encouraged providers to offer these services' at no charge to consumers.

Tom Power, general counsel at CTIA, the wireless trade association, said on Friday that "unwanted calls and texts are a consumer issue the wireless industry works hard to address and we look forward to working with the FCC to help address this challenge together.

The FCC gets hundreds of thousands of complaints annually about robocalls and unwanted text

Wheeler's letters also said providers can do more to ensure that Wheeler said in a blog post on incoming calls are not "spoofed,"

when callers falsify the information transmitted to caller-ID displays to disguise their identity.

Scam artists often try to appear to call from a bank or a government phone to trick consumers into disclosing confidential financial or account information. Other scams pitch phony vacation or mortgage offers.

In the letters, the FCC said the phone industry should create a "Do Not Originate" list that would allow government agencies, banks and healthcare providers, among others, to register their phone numbers and would allow providers to block calls from outside the United States. Many phone scams based overseas target Americans.

The FCC said last year it agreed that phone companies should not block calls without customers permission. Wheeler noted that providers "have suggested that blocking should wait until new Caller ID authentica-

Maine iobless rate ticked up in **June to 3.7%**

PORTLAND — Maine's jobless rate rose slightly in June, to 3.7 percent, as the estimate of people working or in the market for a job rose for the fourth straight month.

The latest estimate of Maine's unemployment rate is down from 4.4 percent one year ago and marks a continuing turnaround of estimates that since the fall of 2013 showed Maine's total employment and workforce as dwindling.

Maine's jobless rate was below the regional average of 4.4 percent, coming in lower than Massachusetts (4.2 percent), Rhode Island (5.5 percent) and Connecticut (5.8 percent). The rate was higher than New Hampshire (2.8 percent) and Vermont (3.2 percent) for June.

The national unemployment rate dropped rose to 4.9 percent in June, up from 4.7 percent in May and down from 5.3 percent one year ago.

A separate survey of employer payrolls estimated that Maine had 4,000 more jobs than one year ago, up to 615,100 in June. Private sector jobs made up all of those gains, with an estimated 6,000 more positions compared with one year ago.

Government payroll jobs were down by about 2,000 positions, to 97,800, which the Maine Department of Labor's Center for Workforce Research and Information reported is the lowest level since 2000.

Wall St. rises, racks up 4th week of gains

Wall Street rose on Friday, clinching the fourth straight positive week for the stock market, boosted by strength in telecom stalwarts AT&T and Verizon.

A U.S. manufacturing report also came in above expectations, building on upbeat data from earlier in the month.

Gains were limited by weakness in reports from industrial companies including General Electric.

The S&P and Dow have broken to all-time records in the past two weeks for the first time in more than a year amid a better-thanfeared corporate earnings season. The S&P closed at another record high on Friday.

"Below it all is just an ongoing trend of better economic reports, said Jim Paulsen, chief investment strategist at Wells Capital Management in Minneapolis. "Some of those are earnings reports, but they all line up to the same thing: It looks like growth is quickening.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 53.62 points, or 0.29 percent, to 18,570.85, the S&P 500 gained 9.86 points, or 0.46 percent, to 2,175.03 and the Nasdaq Composite added 26.26 points, or 0.52 percent, to 5,100.16.

The S&P 500 is up more than 6 percent in 2016, shaking off a rough start to the year and global instability, including Britain's recent vote to leave the European Union.

"We're well past the Brexit fallout and the subsequent rebound, said Peter Kenny, senior market strategist at Global Markets Advisory Group in Berkeley Heights, New Jersey. "We're seeing oil is fairly well-contained and rangebound. So those two variables are off the table, and they have played a big part in triggering volatility.'

All 10 sectors ended higher on Friday, led by utilities and telecoms — defensive, high-dividendpaying groups that have lifted the market this year.

AT&T climbed 1.4 percent after its results. Verizon rose 1.3 percent. The company is the frontrunner for Yahoo's core business, Reuters reported. Yahoo closed up

GE shares slid 1.6 percent. The U.S. industrial conglomerate reported weak demand for new oil, gas and transportation equipment.

Still, second-quarter earnings for S&P 500 companies, which started reporting in earnest this week, are now expected to decline by only 3 percent, less severe than the 4.5 percent drop estimated at the start of the month, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S.
