

High doses of NSAIDs carry more risk

Dear Dr. Roach: I am a DR. KEITH ROACH 44-year-old man with chronic headaches and migraines. Should I worry about the long-term effects of taking an NSAID (such as diclofenac) at least once a week? — G.W.

Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs are among the most commonly taken classes of drugs in the world, with 17 million Americans alone taking them daily. Although these drugs are generally safe, any medication has the potential for side effects. Typically, the higher the dose and the more frequently it is taken, the increased risk of side effects. So, a once-a-week dose would be expected to have a low side effect risk.

Although they can affect multiple systems, let me briefly go over the side effects of NSAIDs on the GI tract, kidnevs and heart.
