Tips for shopping for power in Maine

If you're willing to walk away in a negotiation, that's a sign you've got some leverage.

That's how you should approach competitive electricity offers.

Here are tips we compiled based on advice from the Office of the Maine Public Advocate and interviews of past customers.

Know what you're already **paying.** Most customers receive what's called the standard offer a default option for customers every year. It's like a blind date

That gets set up annually, starting

You can call your utility to determine your current rate or find rate comparisons between the standard offer and competitive electricity providers at the "electricity supply" page of the Maine Public Advocate's website.

Understand what the CEP is offering — not just price. Competitive providers can offer plans that change every month, called variable rates. The public advoprice, which regulators approve as cate's office advises avoiding those plans and making sure that contracts don't eventually roll over

to ask not only whether the plan is variable or fixed, but also when the contract ends and what happens when it does.

Find out if there's a termination fee. Some companies charge a fee for getting out of a fixed-term contract early. Ask about such fees and the amount. You can get out of a variable rate at any time, for a \$5 fee, by calling your utility and asking to be switched back to

the standard offer. If you have buyer's remorse, you have five days to back out. Competitive electricity providers are required to send customers

you may not know you've been on. into variable rates. So, make sure their terms of service before officially signing them up. Those can come by mail, by email or be presented on a company's website. Customers have five calendar days after receiving those terms to back out of a contract, either through verbal or written notification. Customers who get terms by mail have eight calendar days to exercise that right.

How we calculated premium customers paid

Electricity suppliers report their revenue and total megawatt-hours of power sold to different customer classes for the year. They submit it to the U.S. Energy Information Administration on a document called a Form

That data formed the basis of our cost comparison. It includes competitive suppliers that charge at variable rates and big utilities charging the default standard offer price.

The reporting is not comprehensive; it includes only the largest power generators each year. Gulf Electricity, for instance, did not report in 2013 or 2014 because it didn't produce enough power to meet the reporting threshold. But it did in 2015.

Still, by our estimates, the EIA the standard offer rate.

reports covered approximately 90 between 2012 and 2014, based on a comparison with monthly state data on competitive supply customers.

The Form 861 data provides the most comprehensive look at how the state's largest competitive suppliers compared on

We identified two groups of electric generators selling to Maine homeowners: those that won the state standard offer bid and those that marketed and sold electricity directly to residential customers.

For each group, we calculated an annual average cost of electricity by dividing residential electricity sales by the megawatthours sold. Using those numbers, we projected the difference if customers had all bought power at

For each year, we multiplied percent of customers in Maine the price difference per megawatt-hour by the number of megawatts sold by competitive suppliers. In 2012, that number reflected savings for customers. In 2013 and 2014, it reflected customers spending more.

We asked the Maine Office of the Public Advocate, Connecticut Office of Consumer Counsel, the Retail Energy Supply Association and the founders of Electricity Maine to review our key find-

Tim Schneider, Maine's Public Advocate, said the disparity aligned with pricing information his office has tracked monthly and anecdotal information gathered from consumer complaints. Consumer advocates in Connecticut said while they could not weigh in on the BDN's use of EIA data, our findings aligned with their reports.

The Retail Energy Supply Association declined to comment on the BDN's methodology when provided a description of our analysis and findings, but called the similar analysis in Connecticut "comparing apples and oranges.

The BDN also consulted with electricity data experts at the U.S. Energy Information Administration about the contents of Form 861 filings. The EIA did not review or comment specifically on our analysis.

The data give a sense of how the prices compare in aggregate but don't necessarily show that all customers of competitive suppliers would have been better off getting the standard offer in 2013 and 2014. Stocks advance on payroll report

NEW YORK — U.S. stocks advanced on Friday as a weakerthan-expected payrolls report tamped down expectations for a September rate hike from the U.S. Federal Reserve, although hawkish comments from another Fed official kept expectations for one this year intact.

U.S. nonfarm payrolls rose by 151,000 jobs in August after an upwardly revised 275,000 increase in July, with job cuts in manufacturing and construction, the Labor Department said. Economists polled by Reuters had forecast payrolls rising by 180,000 last month.

Traders trimmed the probability of a Fed rate hike this month to 21 percent from the 24 percent chance on Thursday, according to CME Group's FedWatch program. However, the odds for a December rate increase edged up to 54.2 percent from 53.6 percent the previous day

"Equity markets are going to give the Fed at least one rate increase but if they start to perceive a series of hikes coming, and coming sooner than later, that is when equity markets will get a little nervous here," said Sean Lynch, co-head of global equity strategy at Wells Fargo Investment Institute in Omaha.

Despite the soft report, Richmond Federal Reserve Bank President Jeffrey Lacker on Friday said the U.S. economy appears strong enough to warrant significantly higher interest rates.
