


Dear Concerned Daughter: I think you should "handle it" by keeping your trap shut. Not every mother likes/loves her daughter all the time either, but the feeling usually

Consider this: Because you have so many positive things going on in your life, your mother may have had something to do with it, so try to be a little less judgmental.


