



Here's a rundown on the best play. Cy can cash the ace of diamonds at Trick Two, then lead low to his ten. He wants to set up the diamonds without letting East get in for a spade

If West wins and continues clubs, Cy finesses in hearts next. He is sure of at least nine tricks: three diamonds, two hearts, three clubs and a spade.
