The map changes stand to affect home prices as any home in a flood zone with a mortgage is required to get flood insurance.

For homes that are added to the flood zone, Pickford said some banks will factor monthly flood insurance payments into an existing mortgage.

"Anyone who is going to be remapped in a flood zone will have to purchase flood insurance if they have a mortgage," Pickford said. "And that creates a lot of activity and anxiety in the marketplace.'

What's my risk?

Getting a clear picture of flood risk to a home can be tricky as the new maps are rolled out. Preliminary maps from FEMA are available at town offices and online in PDF and geospatial information system formats. Currently, effective maps can be searched by an individual address at FEMA's Flood Map Service Cen-

Knowing that current risk is important for understanding how the pending map changes could affect a given property, whether the property is newly added to a risk zone, decreases in risk or does not change.

wait until 2016. Private payrolls increased 129,000 last month, slowing from 264,000 in February. Employment growth was held back by a decline in the goods producing sector payrolls. Construction employment fell 1,000. Manufacturing, which has been hit by the strong dollar and softer global demand, reduced payrolls by 1,000. Government em-

ployment fell 3,000. The mining sector saw more job losses last month, with payrolls falling 11,000. That reflected ongoing losses in oil and gas extraction, which has taken a hit from lower crude oil prices.

State-level payroll and unemployment estimates for March will be released April 21.

Futures slump follows jobs data disappointment in short stock session

NEW YORK — U.S. stock index futures fell sharply on Friday after a weaker-than-expected March employment report, in thin trading that nonetheless suggests a weak open for stocks on Monday.

The jobs report, showing the economy's weakest job growth in more than a year, follows a string of underwhelming reports on the health of the U.S. economy that suggests softening in growth after a strong finish to 2014.

'With regards to the economy, a poor jobs report, while a surprise relative to consensus, is not a surprise given the weak economic data prints we've seen of late," said Dan Greenhaus, chief strategist at BTIG in New York, in a note.

The reaction indicates a lower open for the market when it resumes trading Monday, as regular U.S. stock markets are closed for Good Friday.

Futures trading was open for an abbreviated 45-minute session following the release of the U.S. employment figures, and volume was thin, with just 95,000 contracts traded, compared with an average daily trade of 1.45 million contracts over the past 200 days.

S&P 500 e-mini futures were down 19.75 points, or nearly 1 percent, indicating a lower open on Monday. Dow Jones industrial average e-mini futures fell 165 points and Nasdaq 100 emini futures lost 43.75 points.

On Thursday, the equity market rebounded from two days of losses. The Dow Jones industrial average rose 65.06 points, or 0.37 percent, to 17,763.24, the S&P 500 gained 7.27 points, or 0.35 percent, to 2,066.96, and the Nasdaq Composite added 6.71 points, or 0.14 percent, to 4,886.94.

Obama plugs solar program to train veterans

HILL AIR FORCE BASE, Utah — President Barack Obama on Friday unveiled an expansion of U.S. government efforts to train military veterans for jobs in the solar power industry during a visit to Utah.

The administration announced a new goal of training 75,000 people to enter the solar workforce by 2020. That is an increase from a goal announced last year of training 50,000 workers by the same deadline.

Many of those workers would be veterans, administration officials said.

The Department of Defense plans to have "Solar Ready Vets" programs at 10 bases across the country to train military members who are returning to civilian life for solar jobs. "It's going to train transi-

tioning military personnel for careers in this growing industry," Obama said of the program during remarks at Hill Air Force Base in Utah, standing near a set of solar panel installations.

Officials declined to provide a figure for what the programs would cost.
