Penobscot River fishing trip up for grabs at Old Town Rotary Club auction

Two five-hour guided fishing trips on the Penobscot River, a work party by Old Town Rotarians, a handmade portable bar, a custom-drawn portrait and a mystery dinner for eight are just a few of the items that will be up for bid at the Old Town Rotary Club 10th annual charity auction Thursday, May 5, at the Elks Lodge in Old Town.

The club expects to have up for bid approximately 75 live auction items and an equal number of silent auction items, including a wide variety of merchandise, handcrafted items, services, and vacation and recreation opportunities.

The evening will start with viewing of auction items and a buffet dinner featuring peppered beef and roasted turkey 5-6 p.m. The live auction will begin at 6:30 p.m. The event also will offer door prizes, a card game and a Scottish auction of a rum cake made by Deanie Greenleaf.

The cost is \$15 per person. Tickets are available at Gossamer Press in Old Town, or from any Old Town Rotarian. Call 852-3037 to reserve a full table in advance. Proceeds will benefit the Maine Youth Fish and Game Association, Sarah’s House, the Old Town Animal Orphanage and other Rotary charities.

Among the items that will be auctioned will be food items from Rotarians or friends of Rotary, including many homemade desserts. Other auction items include quantities of gravel, loam, mulch and cement; boxes of Maine blueberries; lube and oil changes, an original painting, and gift certificates for lodging, meals, merchandise, a block of four Skybox tickets to a UMaine hockey game, and an annual membership to Hidden Meadows Golf Course in Old Town. UMaine coaches receive contract extensions

Black Bears baseball coach Steve Trimper and women’s soccer coach Scott Atherley both have signed three-year extensions, Creech announced April 20.

They join men’s ice hockey coach Red Gendron and women’s basketball coach Richard Barron among the program leaders who have agreed to continue working at UMaine.

Trimper is in his 11th season at UMaine since taking over for Paul Kostopoulos. He has directed the Black Bears to a 300-280-2 record, which places him second behind only the late John Winkin (642-430-3) in program history.

Under Trimper, UMaine won the 2011 America East championship and made NCAA Regional appearances in 2006 and 2011. The Black Bears have made six consecutive conference tournament appearances.

Trimper was named the America East Coach of the Year in 2013 after leading UMaine to the top seed in the conference tournament. He has a career record of 472-455-3.

Atherley is completing his 17th season as a UMaine’s head coach. His teams have posted an overall record of 136-123-32.

Atherley’s Black Bears have made four straight league tourney appearances and reached the America East finals from 2003 to 2006 and again in 2010.

Atherley, whose extension will pay him \$69,999 per year, is a 1988 UMaine graduate who was a four-year letterwinner for the Black Bears, also coached the men’s soccer program for seven seasons before its being eliminated.
