ducted by the composer himself and recorded with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, was released on Sept. 1, and the title track, his Concerto for Piano and Orchestra, will be among the first pieces performed during the Bangor Symphony Orchestra's 120th season kickoff concert.

The concert, set for 3 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 27 at the Collins Center for the Arts, offers up a program that's equal parts contemporary and and classic. "In Truth" premiered with the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra in 2013,

with pianist Jeffrey Biegel as soloist; Biegel will perform with the BSO this weekend as well.

"It was written for [Biegel], with whom I've had the opportunity to work before... and he's been on the forefront of getting new American composers to write work for piano and orchestra," said Richman. "It's one of those once in a lifestyle things, for a relatively unknown composer to be featured on an album with a major symphony orchestra."
